ITINERARY

SATURDAY:

Our departure location is Alimos Marina, Athens. As usual, after a lazy morning, Admiral Mila will be leading the provisioning raiding party, while the skippers, with the help of Capt. Belen, will get checked in on their yachts. When we are finally released, we will set sail for nearby Aegina, where we will spend the night and have dinner at a local taverna.

SUNDAY:

Off we go to Cape Sounion to visit the temple of Poseidon. After all, as sailors, we must pay our respect to Old Poseidon and make sure that he blesses us with calm seas during that week. The sunset from the temple is breathtaking. We will be at anchor there for the night and dinghy to shore to one of the local tavernas for dinner. Capt. Belen told us that being at anchor in the dark and looking at the illuminated temple of Poseidon up the hill is a magical experience.

MONDAY:

From Cape Sounion to Poros is about 28NM. Let's hope Poseidon's blessings work...
We will spend the night in Poros where, of course, we will enjoy the local specialties in one of the port's tavernas. Poros is a very touristic and lively vacation destination, and you will have no problems finding entertainment there.

TUESDAY:

This will be a short sail when we aim for the peninsula of Methana.

This volcanic peninsula has thermal spas where, after a hike to the volcanic crater, we can rest our old bones in healing mineral waters. Even if you are not a scientist, you will guess the origin of the name methane gas.

We will spend the night in the nearby typical fishing village of Vathy. Belen describes it as gorgeous and not to be missed. This is a tiny village with limited docking access. In case we do not find enough space, we will spend the night at the dock in Methana.

WEDNESDAY:

Not to be missed will be the old city of Epidavros where a visit to the temple of Asklepius and its famous theater, the largest well preserved one in Greece. Asklepios was the God of Medicine and the medical professionals among our sailors will not want to miss this land tour.













THURSDAY:

We have to make our way back towards Athens but we will spend the night on Moni Island, near Aegina, where peacock and deer roam freely. They are not afraid of humans and will make for great photo opportunities.

Dinner on board.

FRIDAY:

This is the last day of our trip, and we must return to our base but not without some more sailing, swimming, and snorkeling before we arrive back at the base around 17:00.

You can check in at a local hotel or spend the last night on the yacht and disembark by 9:00 am Saturday morning.
